**1) State Energy Program** **\$218,782,000**

*State Energy Conservation Office (SECO)* **\$218,782,000**

Applications Due:

Comprehensive Applications due by May 12, 2009.

The Secretary of Energy has up to 60 days to approve the application.

Legal Authority:

Federal Regulations: 10 CFR, Part 420

**2) Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grants** **\$208,759,900**

---

Direct Allocations to Cities and Counties **\$163,121,800**  
(Cities over 35,000/Counties over 200,000)

*State Energy Conservation Office (SECO)* **\$45,638,100**

- *Small Cities and Counties (60%)* **\$27,382,860**
- *SECO discretion (40%)* **\$18,255,240**

Applications Due:

States must submit their applications by May 26, 2009.

Direct allocation cities and counties must submit their applications by June 25, 2009.

The Secretary of Energy has up to 120 days to approve the application.

Federal Law: Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007, Subtitle E, Sections 541-548

**3) Energy Efficient Appliance Rebate Program** **\$20,400,000**  
(estimated)

*State Energy Conservation Office (SECO)* **\$20,400,000**

Congress appropriated \$300 million nationwide to this rebate program. DOE is currently in the process of determining state allocations and writing guidance for the program. Expectations are that the funding will be divided up based on some type of population formula.
